Marking Scheme

Full Mistakes:

- i. Omission / addition of any word/figure.
- ii. Substitution of any word/figure in place of dictated word/figure.

The above mistakes are counted as full mistakes and marked by **red ink**.

Half Mistakes:

- i. Spelling Mistake.
- ii. Noñ use / wrong use of Full Stop or Question Mark.
- iii. Use of singular instead of plural and vice-versa.

The above mistakes are counted as half mistakes and marked by **blue ink**.

$$\text{Total Mistakes} = \text{Full Mistakes} + (\text{Half Mistakes} \div 2)$$

- Maximum Marks are 50.
- One mark is deducted for one mistake. Hence, if the total mistakes reach 50, the marks will be zero.
- In case of use of longhand in place of shorthand, the marks awarded will be Nil.
- In case of incomplete transcription (more than 50 words left), the marks will be zero.
- Marks Awarded = Maximum Marks – Total Mistakes.

Speed / Accuracy Calculation:

- Upto 7% mistakes (i.e. 28 words) in Hindi Shorthand transcription are relaxed.
- Only those candidates, who will come within this limit of 7%, will be treated as qualified. However, marks will be awarded on the basis of actual mistakes committed.
- Total Mistakes Committed for the purpose of speed calculation = Actual Mistakes – Relaxation
- Speed (wpm) :

$(\text{Total Words} - \text{Total Mistakes Committed}) \div \text{Time of Dictation}$
